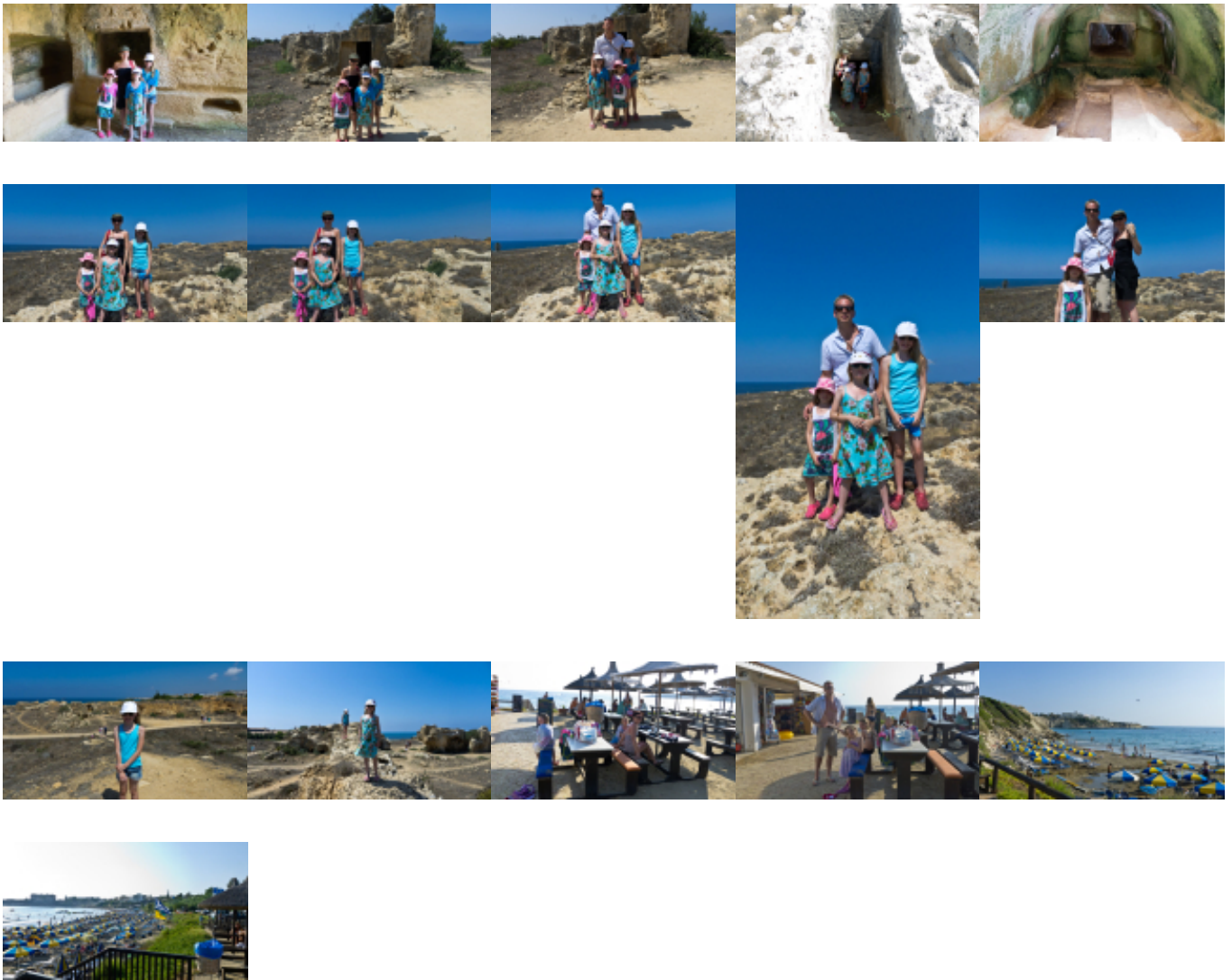
Time teaching Kahra to snorkel in the pool the other night was well spent and she loved snorkelling in the sea around the rocks and spotting the few fish that were there.
